Akakoro'anga (Purpose)

Our homework policy aims to provide opportunities for parents to engage in their child's education. We recognise that the partnership between school and parents is fundamental to the academic success of our children which should be reflected in a collaborative approach to homework. As a student advances on their learning journey the goal is that they become involved in self-motivated study.

Te au Kaveinga (Guidelines)

- 1) Homework will contribute to, reinforce and/or complement the classroom programme.
- 2) Classroom teachers will clearly communicate their expectations for homework for their year level at the beginning of each term.
- 3) As a school we recognise that what is considered best practice for homework is continually evolving globally and has moved past worksheets as the predominant tool and we commit to ensuring that we align our approach with contemporary practices.
- 4) While all children should have homework resources available to them, we recognize that students have different home environments and commitments outside of school.
- 5) It is encouraged for parents to apply and expand on school learning at home, which includes reading and deliberately engaging in conversation with a child.
